2020-11-25-05 (B-1) All Divisions – Agricultural Fieldman Report <u>File: N/A</u>

Jeff Fleischer, Agriculture and Environment Manager, reported on the following:

- Agricultural Service Boards are unique to North America. They are special committees appointed by the local municipal council to address agricultural concerns in their communities. Agricultural Service Boards play a critical role in assessing the needs and direction of the agriculture industry in the County, as well as identifying obstacles and working to resolve any problems that may arise. Alberta Agriculture and Forestry has created a Fact Sheet and Orientation Manual for new Agricultural Service Board Members and it is attached in this report.
- 2. The new 5-year 2020-2024 ASB grant program agreements have been signed and the payment should be processed shortly. Funding for the Resource Management stream has been delayed and the final decision on this grant will be made by March 2021. The Rocky View County ASB received \$123,907.21 in support of our legislated activities, which is down 26% from the 2017-2019 grant.
- 3. The Agricultural and Environmental Services seasonal operations have concluded for the season.
 - Agricultural and Environmental Services hired a reduced seasonal crew for the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The seasonal Equipment Operators commenced on June 1, 2020 and the Crop and Weed Inspectors commenced on June 8, 2020.
 - We received 117 weed complaints and managed 414 weed cases in 2020. Overall, we achieved an 83% compliance rate on the weed inspection program.
 - Roadsides in Divisions 1, 4 and 9 were inspected and controlled for noxious weeds and encroaching vegetation on gravel roads.
 - The roadside mowing program was completed ahead of schedule. The operators completed one pass on all roads and a second pass in select areas of the County where required.
 - Three additional fields of clubroot were confirmed in 2020. Administration increased the number of canola fields surveyed by over 100 fields this season, in order to gain an accurate assessment of the clubroot area.
 - The full details of our operational programs will be summarized in the annual report that will be provided to the board in the spring of 2021.

Presenter: Mason Austen, Solid Waste and Recycling Advisor

Rocky View County hosted 8 Ag Recycling Roundups in 2020, down from 9 in years prior. The events ran on Wednesdays from July 15th to September 2nd, 2020. Despite having less events, and the need to shift the dates of the events to respond to Covid-19, the 2020 roundups saw an attendance of 362, up from the previous high of 348 in 2018. Compared to previous trends, the 2020 events were used more for used oil and wire recycling and less utilized for grain bag and twine recycling. This could be due in part to the new provincial pilot program allowing for more convenient agriculture plastics recycling opportunities year round throughout the province.

Since 2019, the Irricana Transfer Site has been a host collection location in the three year Alberta Ag-Plastics Recycle It! pilot program. The pilot program is funded by the Alberta

Government, led by Alberta Plastics Recycling Group (APRG), and run by CleanFarms. Six new host sites were added in 2020 bringing the total to 26 across the province. Being a host site means getting compensated for the handling of the materials and receiving \$55/metric tonne for materials shipped for recycling. In the first year of the program Rocky View County has shipped 46 tonnes of material for processing with an expectation of shipping approximately 25 more. This is slightly higher than the 2019 total amount shipped (grain bags and twine).
