The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$14,000, with a forecasted revenue of \$14,000, including the requested funds. The requested funds are 36% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Bragg Creek Trails Association

The Bragg Creek Trails Association is a volunteer-run nonprofit dedicated to maintaining and advocating for the multi-use trail systems in Bragg Creek and surrounding areas.

Bragg Creek Trails Association serves 17,000 County and 1,700 non-County residents.

Application Review:

An operational funding request of \$27,685 has been submitted to support the organization's operational expenses.

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are approximately \$648,000, with a forecasted revenue of \$650,000, including the requested funds. The requested funds are approximately 4.3% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Division 2

Calgary Rangers Soccer Club and Sport Association

The Calgary Rangers Soccer Club and Sport Association offers both recreational and competitive soccer opportunities for players of all ages across the Calgary region to provide a fun and supportive environment where kids can develop soccer skills while encouraging creativity and risk-taking.

Calgary Rangers Soccer Club serves 164 County and 837 non-County residents.

Application Review:

An operational funding request of \$50,000 has been submitted to support the organization's operational expenses.

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$1,330,985, with a forecasted revenue of \$330,300, including the requested funds. The requested funds are 4% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Webber Wildcats Baseball

Division 3

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$727,750, with a forecasted revenue of \$682,500, including the requested funds. The requested funds are 6% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Division 4

Madden Curling Club

An operational funding request of \$17,320 has been submitted to support the operational expenses of maintenance, utilities, salaries, and wages.

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$39,511, with a forecasted revenue of \$22,317 44including the requested funds. The requested funds are 44% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Administration recommends approval of up to \$17,320 in operational funding.

Madden & District Agricultural Society

Madden & District Agricultural Society promotes activities, programs, and facilities to enhance the lives of a diverse rural community.

Madden & District Agricultural Society serves 2000 County and 2000 non-County residents.

Application Review:

An operational funding request of \$17,870 has been submitted to support operational expenses.

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$116,634, with a forecasted revenue of \$95,545, including the requested funds. The requested funds are 15% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Dartique Community Hall Association

Division 5

Butler Park Community Association

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$234,530, with a forecasted revenue of \$234,530, including the requested funds. The requested funds are 19% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Dalroy UFA Association

Application Review:

An operational funding request of \$14,500 has been submitted to support the operational expenses oof utilities, playground inspection, landscaping, and snow removal.

The anticipated operational costs for 2025 are \$26,854, with a forecasted revenue of \$17,800, including the requested funds. The requested funds are 54% of the anticipated operational expenses for 2025.

Dalroy Gymkhana Club

Dalroy Gymkhana Club serves 30 County and 10 non-County residents.

Application Review:
