Division 2

Jumping Pound Community Hall Society

The Jumping Pound Community Hall Society was formally established in 2010 to manage and operate the historical 95-year-old community hall. The community hall serves as a central gathering place for local residents and the general public for celebrations, recreational activities, and events. The Jumping Pound Community Hall is operated by the Jumping Pound Community Hall Society and is owned by the County.

The Jumping Pound Community Hall Society serves 510 County and 800 non-County residents.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$55,000 is being requested for 50% of the total cost for the Flooring and Window Replacement Project, totaling \$110,000.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$55,000 in capital funding.

Division 3

Yamnuska Wolfdog Sanctuary

The Yamnuska Wolfdog Sanctuary's mission is to provide rescued wolfdogs with a meaningful and fulfilled life, while offering experiential education to promote the well-being and understanding of wolfdogs within the domestic world.

The organization serves 1,000 County and 36,000 non-County residents.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$125,000 is being requested for 19% of the total cost for the Yamnuska Wolfdog Sanctuary Community Day Use Area, totaling \$671,449.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$125,000 in capital funding.

Golden Rod Community Association

The Golden Rod Community Association maintains and operates the Golden Rod Community Hall (built 1927) and offers community activities. The hall is also a meeting space for local clubs, agriculture groups, guilds, and more.

The organization sees 9,263 County visits and 9,179 non-County visits per year.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$6,330 is being requested for 50% of the total cost for the kitchen sinks and counters project, totaling \$12,652.75.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$6,330 in capital funding.

Bow Valley Agricultural Society

Bow Valley Agricultural Society oversees the safe and responsible operations of the Indus Recreation Centre and associated facilities. The Society encourages community spirit for individuals and families in the rural community through professionalism and integrity. The goal is to maintain facilities, enable volunteers, support programs, and related services, based on the community needs.

The Society serves 3,000+ County and 2,000+ non-County residents.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$17,250 is being requested for 50% of the total cost for septic line repair project, totaling \$34,500.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$17,250 in capital funding.

Bow Valley Community Club

The Bow Valley Community Club offers curling opportunities to the Southeast portion of Rocky View County and neighbouring municipalities of Calgary and Chestermere.

The Club serves 1,500 County and 1,000 non-County residents.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$14,105 is being requested for 50% of the total cost of the Make-up Air Unit and Ice Scraper Project, totaling \$28,202.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$14,105 in capital funding.

Langdon Community Association

Langdon Community Association serves as a community gathering place where residents of all ages come together for event celebrations, community engagements, and opportunities to connect.

The Association serves 6,000 County and 1,000 non-County residents.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$75,000 is being requested for 50% of the total cost for the Outdoor Arena Replacement Project, totaling approximately \$150,000.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$75,000 in capital funding.

Cochrane BMX Association

Cochrane BMX Association is a welcoming cycling community that offers programs for riders of all skill levels to help cyclists develop their bike-handling skills and confidence. The Association serves riders across the Town of Cochrane and Rocky View County and fosters a supportive and family-friendly environment where riders can enhance their skills, build confidence, and connect with fellow enthusiasts.

The Cochrane BMX Association serves 78 County and 500 non-County residents.

Application Review:

Capital funding of \$21,670 is being requested for 25% of the total cost for site improvements including picnic tables, a sound system, bleachers, and port-o-potties, totaling approximately \$87,000.

This application meets the requirements of Policy C-317.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends approval of up to \$21,670 in capital funding.
