ADMINISTRATION'S RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Agricultural Service Board receives the Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation Update Report for information.

BACKGROUND

Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation (AAI) transitioned the Agricultural Service Board Key Contact Program to a Regional Liaison approach. The intent of the program remains the same and serves to promote open and effective communication between ASB's and Alberta Agriculture and Irrigation.

DISCUSSION

Highlights:

- 1. 2025–2029 ASB Grant
 - Once an application is approved by the ASB Program, it is entered into the grant management system for processing and approval.
 - The grant agreement is then sent for municipal wet signatures. Upon return, the agreement is signed by Agriculture and Irrigation (AGI) and processed for payment approval.
 - Once approved, the first payment of the grant cycle is issued to the applicant.

In the event of a Canada Post strike, cheques will be held and issued after the strike ends.

2. 2024 ASB Grant Reporting

- Final reporting for the 2019–2024 ASB Grant cycle is open until June 30, 2025.
- The reporting link and forms for submitting income and expenditures have been distributed.
- A reminder to also submit your reports to Municipal Affairs.
- 3. Weed Review Recommendations
 - AGI staff are finalizing documentation to submit recommendations from the Weed Review Committee (WRC) to the Minister for decision.
 - A summary will be shared with WRC members for regional updates.
 - Stakeholders will be informed of the Minister's decisions once available.

- AGI will work with stakeholders to update relevant resources to align with any approved changes to the Prohibited Noxious and Noxious weed lists.
- 4. Moisture Update
 - The most recent Moisture Update was issued on May 21, 2025 (attached).
- 5. Alberta Plant Health Laboratory (APHL)
 - All Ag Fieldmen and ASBs have been sent an email with:
 - A fact sheet
 - Submission form
 - Contact details for the APHL
 - The APHL, part of AGI's Plant and Bee Health Surveillance Section, provides:
 - Diagnostics for crop and plant diseases (e.g., clubroot, blackleg, Dutch elm disease)
 - Molecular identification of regulated weeds and invasive species
 - o Surveillance of new and emerging pests affecting agriculture
- 6. Crop Disease Monitoring Update
 - Thank you to ASBs for continued support of Alberta's crop disease surveys.
 - Surveys help maintain a strong crop assurance program by rating disease symptoms in the field and testing samples in the lab.
 - In-crop monitoring occurs July–October, with lab testing October–April.
 - Survey results are used for monitoring, trade resolution, and guiding product placement.

Surveys include:

- Peas (5 diseases)
- Wheat foliar (8)
- Barley foliar (7)
- Irrigated seed alfalfa (3)
- Dry beans (6)
- Lentils (8)
- Flax (7)
- Canola (4)
- Wheat head (6)
- A 2024 results summary will be shared with each municipality shortly.
- 2025 surveys will repeat 2024 protocols, with the same targets.
- Major ASB contributions include: Canola Health Survey and Wheat/Barley Head Survey.
- Protocols, training, and materials (bags, foot coverings) will be distributed in the coming weeks.
- 7. Canada's Food System Campaign
 - National launch of *Canada's Food System: Our Food, Our Future* a public trust campaign led by the Canadian Centre for Food Integrity.
 - Aims to celebrate and raise awareness of Canada's globally respected food system.
 - Learn more and sign the pledge at Canada's Food System Canada's Food System.

8.Wild Board

- 539 wild boar have been removed to date.
- Trapping success has slowed due to increased natural food availability.
- Alberta Pork trappers are scouting new areas and acquiring permissions for fall operations.

Program updates:

- Government is reviewing potential changes to the farmed wild boar industry, including a possible phase-out.
- Stakeholder engagement (April–May) included producers, processors, auction markets, and ASB Provincial Committee reps.
- AGI will analyze feedback and develop next steps over summer.
- Wild Boar Tours (spring/summer) are being offered in partnership with Alberta Pork to:
 - Observe wild boar signs and habitat
 - Learn detection tips using remote cameras
- Invitations extended to high-priority regions; other regions may join if space permits.
- Travel funding is available. Contact: Hannah McKenzie, Wild Boar Specialist.
- 9. Compound 1080
 - Final proof of Compound 1080 outer packaging is underway to meet Health Canada/PMRA regulations.
 - Ag Fieldmen will be contacted to confirm participation and arrange delivery.
 - Development of the Product Stewardship Program continues. More details to come this fall.
 - A 30-minute update is scheduled for the program at IST this fall.
