
HISTORY:

- **September 3, 2019** Phase 2 Development Permit, PRDP20185144, was issued, and included trail infrastructure relating to the construction of two pedestrian bridges, one culvert spanning Crossfield Creek, the Rosebud River and a drainage ditch adjacent to the Village of Beiseker.
- June 25, 2019 Phase 2 Development Permit, PRDP20185144, was approved.
- **September 25, 2018** Phase 1 was approved by Council, including the redesignation of the lands from Ranch and Farm District to DC 160.

PUBLIC & AGENCY SUBMISSIONS:

Various forms of Community engagement has commenced through each phase of this proposal. In August 2020, 58 adjacent residents were circulated, including County residents, Town of Irricana residents and the Village of Beiseker residents. To date, 25 letters were received in support and 1 letter was received in opposition of the application. The responses have been included in Attachment 'D.'

The application was also circulated to a number of internal and external agencies and, where appropriate, conditions of approval have been proposed based on these comments.



On behalf of Alberta TrailNet Society and Meadowlark Trail Society, we hope this letter finds you well. As an adjacent landowner to the Meadowlark Trail, you will have received information on our current Development Permit application from Rocky View County. The purpose of this letter is to provide a brief update.

PROJECT UPDATE

Since receiving approval from Council on the Meadowlark Trail land use re-designation (Direct Control District, DC-160) in September 2018, the Meadowlark Trail Society and Alberta TrailNet have been working on two development permit applications to facilitate the construction of the trail:

September 2019: the first development permit application for the Trail was approved for the installation and construction of two bridges and one culvert along the Meadowlark Trail. The bridges and culvert have since been constructed and are currently closed until trail construction is complete.

July 2020: Alberta TrailNet submitted the second development permit application to Rocky View County Administration for review. This development permit application is for trail construction, road crossings, and related trail facilities and amenities for the Meadowlark Trail.

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT APPLICATION FOR TRAIL CONSTRUCTION

The Development Permit (DP) application submitted to Rocky View in July 2020 provides the details required to support trail construction and related trail amenities for the Meadowlark Trail. The DP application includes the proposed landscaping along the trail and the screening and buffering proposed between the trail and select private properties.

Additional information included in the DP application includes signage (types and locations of signs), communication content (trail user information, emergency response plans), transportation safety (ensuring safety requirements at road crossings), maintenance schedules, and storm water management. This information is available on the Rocky View County website:

MEETING PLANS

Once harvest is complete we hope you will join us for a meeting where we would share and discuss the detailed plans and mitigations for the portion of trail adjacent to your property. Due to the public health situation, we would be happy to arrange a virtual meeting with you. If you are not comfortable meeting online, or do not have access to the Internet, we would be happy to

arrange a socially distanced in-person meeting. Meetings will likely be held during the month of October.

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT PROCESS

The following is a high-level overview of the development permit process and approximate timelines:

- Submission of Development Permit Application to Rocky View County (July 21, 2020)
- Circulation and review of application to Rocky View Administration and key agencies (4-6 weeks)
- Adjacent landowner meetings (proposed for first half of October, 2020)
- Meadowlark Trail Project Team will review County comments and revise the application accordingly (September 2020)
- Once all requirements are met to the satisfaction of County Administration, the application will be taken to Rocky View Council for review and approval (Fall 2020)
- Initiation of trail construction (subject to approvals) (Fall 2020)
