Crime Reduction

- The Integrated Rural Unit is comprised of both Beiseker & Airdrie Rural members
- The Integrated Rural Unit and the Airdrie Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) have been conducting curfew checks to ensure condition compliance
- Enhanced patrols of "hot spots" and "emerging crime trend" areas
- The Integrated Rural Unit conducts regular patrols of residential and industrial areas within the communities/rural areas while on duty
- Collaboration with Fish and Wildlife to conduct checks during hunting season on poachers.
- CRU Rocky View Enhanced Position: The CRU position allocated to Rocky View County allows rural access to the specialized investigative techniques of the plain clothes unit



Community Engagement

- RVC engages when there are events which require our support and or presence, this may include increased resourcing, joint teams with RVC Enforcement Team
- Active engagement with the Alberta Provincial Rural Crime Watch Association with the NCO i/c and Crossfield Enhanced member acting as liaisons to the association
 - This involves presentations and/or impromptu Q&A sessions with the members
- Management team participation in RVCTown Hall meeting establishing open communication with stakeholders
- Management team presented to the Balzac Business Community Association in a Town hall format
- Members engage in foot patrols through the two large malls and the casino enhancing accessibility to the public
- Participated in the Kathyrn School Walkathon along with RVC Fire and Peace Officers.
- Beiseker NCO i/c has been actively engaged in the Community Safety and Well-being Committee.




Road Safety

- In general members spend a great deal of time patrolling County roads and conducting traffic enforcement as the need arises – with our new resources we are much more available for this than ever before




Calls for Service – By the Numbers

Airdrie 2021 Crime Gauge



January to December: 2019-2021









Top 10 Occurrence Types by File Count Traffic Offences Excluded














Calls for Service-Top 10 Occurrence Types by File Count

Domestic Violence Statistics

Monthly occurrences involving domestic violence from 2019-2021



Langdon

- In 2021 there were 509 calls for service in Langdon, including traffic offences which comprised 139 of those calls.
- The most common call types were Mental Health Act (29), Suspicious Person/Vehicle/Property (26) and Assistance to Canadian Provincial Agency (17).
- There were a total of 19 assaults, including four assaults with a weapon and two assaults on a police officer.
- There were 12 break and enters, 7 vehicle thefts, and 20 incidents of theft under \$5000
